You Said	We did
Priority 1:- Road Safety	The beat team have been conducting high visibility patrols of the areas to try to deter traffic offences from occurring.
Priority 2:- ASB	Officers are still in the process of investigating a number of ASB cases this month including incidents involving issues with youths and neighbour issues.
Priority 3:- Burglaries	Officers have been working on the investigations of burglary offences that have occurred across the area.

Fake £50 Scottish bank notes have been used in the Kirby Muxloe area recently. If you are a business please make sure you are familiar with security markings on bank notes including the UV security markings and ensure you check all notes under a UV light.

We have had a positive result in a recent antisocial behaviour case. This was an incident in the Leicester Forest East area whereby youths were throwing items into a resident's rear garden. A youth was identified as being involved in this behaviour and has been dealt with as per our anti-social behaviour incremental approach.





Over the coming weeks we will see celebrations for Halloween, Diwali and Bonfire Night and unfortunately at this time of the year there are Individuals who use this

occasion as an excuse to

cause trouble for residents. It is essential to remember the importance of celebrating safely and respecting those who choose to not take part. Remember....

- You must be 18 or over to purchase fireworks.
- For Halloween only visit properties with displays/ pumpkins etc.
- There is a Midnight curfew for fireworks during Bonfire Night.
- There is a 1am curfew for fireworks during Diwali.
- Be kind to your neighbours especially with pets and choose to attend an organised display.
- Allow children to carry torches or glow sticks to
- allow drivers to see them.
  - Finally, have fun, be respectful and stay safe.

PC Dave attended a call from a victim who'd had their 2 vehicles stolen from their driveway following a burglary. Our Roads Policing Unit tracked down and recovered the first vehicle and with a little help from modern day technology the victim was able to track the second vehicle and led us straight to it. The vehicle was tracked to Desford and recovered for our forensic colleagues. CCTV enquiries are still ongoing.


